A Youth as Resources funded project must meet all of the following criteria:

- Youth led, youth initiated projects with youth defined as 5 - 20 years of age
- Detailed budget stating how dollars will be used
- Project must meet an identified community need
- Project location must be within the Delano School District
- Results summary including - what was accomplished and what was learned
- Projects will promote individual or community growth
- Any grant dollars not used will come back to Youth as Resources Board
- *Grant requests will be at least \$50 and will not exceed \$500

**The board does have discretion over any actual awarded grant dollars*
